PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

RIVER RESTORATION

Fish Passage - Pawcatuck River

- ~* Engineering, design, permitting and construction for the removal of Lower Shannock Falls was completed by WPWA in partnership with The Town's of Richmond & Charlestown, the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management, USDOC's National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration, Rhode Island Coastal Resource Management Council, USDA's Natural Resource Conservation Service, US Fish & Wildlife Service, Save the Bay, Trout Unlimited, Rhode Island Historical Preservation & Heritage Commission, Fuss & O'Neill Inc and MAS Building & Bridge.
- ~* Engineering, design and permitting for the 2010 construction of a Denil Fish Ladder & Eelway at the iconic Horseshoe Falls Dam was completed by WPWA with funding and technical support from USDOC's National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration, Rhode Island Coastal Resource Management Council, US Fish & Wildlife Service, and the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management. Special thanks to landowner Jeffrey Marlowe, dam owner Francis Flynn, and resident historian Sanford Neuschatz for their support of the Lawson M. Cary Jr Memorial Fishway.
- ~* Preliminary engineering investigations at the Kenyon Mill Dam were initiated by WPWA thanks to significant funding provided by USDOC's National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration and Rhode Island Coastal Resource Management Council.

SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH AND DATA COLLECTION

Invasive Species Survey

- ↻ WPWA partnered with RIDEM to map Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) on the Wood and Pawcatuck Rivers. RIDEM had previously surveyed for AIS on only ponds and lakes in RI.
- ↻ Eighteen WPWA volunteers covered ten segments of the Wood and Pawcatuck Rivers during August and September, when the AIS are normally in bloom.
- ↻ AIS were documented on five river segments, two on the Pawcatuck and three on the Wood.
- ↻ Species documented included variable milfoil (*Myriophyllum heterophyllum*), Eurasian milfoil (*Myriophyllum spicatum*), and mudmat (*Glossostigma cleistanthum*).
- ↻ Results suggest that the Lower Wood River has suffered, or is at risk of, severe losses of biodiversity. See full report by Evan Ross, RIDEM, on the WPWA website.

*WPWA & the US Fish & Wildlife Service released beetles in the watershed for control of invasive Purple Loosestrife during 2010.

Water Quality Monitoring

- ↻ The Water Quality Data Management Project was completed by Elise Torello for all the sites in the watershed, including many historic sites. 137 data sites in the Pawcatuck Watershed are mapped and results available on WPWA's website.
- ↻ WPWA completed 23 years of water quality monitoring in the watershed.
- ↻ 35 volunteers monitored 10 lakes and ponds and 20 streams and rivers.

Paddle Programs

- ↯ Source to Sea on the Wood River in June had 33 participants, 7 of whom completed all 38 miles of paddling over 4 weeks. URE Outfitters donated gifts for the participants and Pizza Place donated pizza for the party on the last day.
- ↯ WPWA also offered six well attended paddle trips in July and August.
